All of these are among our favorite memories. We are grateful to be part of the long line of people who have sustained the work of Clear Lake Township Land Conservancy for almost three decades. Our mission is to "preserve, protect, and manage the natural environment within the Clear Lake Watershed and Township for future generations". Many of our memories and efforts are centered on water and sustaining it for the future.

A key part of the Conservancy's mission is environmental education. Recent developments involving the Michindoh Aquifer raise important and troubling issues about sound management of this huge body of water underlying parts of Ohio, Michigan and Indiana, including our Clear Lake Watershed.

The Conservancy's role is to offer public education about the natural environment we preserve and protect. Over the past months, we have regularly compiled public news and information on the Aquifer here. We are also co-sponsoring (with the Town of Clear Lake) a community presentation by Professor Jeremy Rentz of Trine University on Wednesday, May 29th at 6pm at the Clear Lake Yacht Club. We encourage all of us to be better informed about the background, issues and possible next steps that potentially affect our underlying water source. We hope you will review the web materials and attend if you are able.

Some of our favorite memories also come from community gatherings. SummerFest 2019 will bring us together again at the Yacht Club on June 22nd to see old friends, make new ones and raise funds to benefit and sustain the work and mission of the Conservancy.

Environmental Education


The Conservancy's Environmental Education Programs are integral to appreciating the treasure we have in the Clear Lake Watershed. We are excited to introduce two new tools for your ongoing education about the world we share.

Since the *Clear Thinking* newsletter began publication in June 2015, we've featured stories about most Conservancy properties and about Water Quality testing. We've defined terms that help us understand our natural environment (like "ditches" and "conservation easements") and celebrated our growing list of friends and donors who support the CLTLC's work.

Now there's an easier way for you to find that article or term you remember reading. A powerful but easy to use search capability has been added to the <u>website!</u> Can't remember when you made your last donation? Looking for the namesake of Flora Husselman Trumbull Nature Preserve? Can't recall the names of the four ditches that flow into Clear Lake? Try the new search feature.

We are also making available **Blue Papers** prepared as part of our ongoing Board Education process. These concise, generally one-page papers provide excellent background for understanding Land Conservancy concepts. The first three Blue Papers are: Water Quality Testing 101, Conservancy Terms and Conservation Easements. All can be found on the Conservancy website here.

Our natural environment is interesting and an integral part of our lives here. We should never stop learning! Let us know what you think about these tools and pass along any suggestions you have for other education programs. In the Fort Wayne location, we worked with the "Hugs & Mugs" Program where adults with Down Syndrome are involved in all aspects of design, production and retail of high quality coffee mugs. The goals of this Program are to increase self-confidence, career skill knowledge, personal wellness and quality of life for the participants.
