SEASONS ARE CHANGING

Have you had enough cold, wet weather? Are the green leaves, colorful flowers and warm sun welcome sights? Yes, and Yes! Welcome back to the Lake! The Conservancy kept moving ahead through the winter, even when it wasn't easy.

After a challenging winter, the Conservancy is different, but also the same. The Conservancy's focus remains on the three priorities the entire community supports: clear and clean water; protected land; and environmental education. What's different? For seven years. Bridget Harrison was the familiar "face" of the Conservancy. When Bridget decided she needed to move closer to family, the 14 Board members followed the normal process. They appointed a search committee. They drafted a position statement for the Executive Director role. They publicized the position in the land trust community, at both the national and regional levels. They reviewed applications, interviewed candidates, and ultimately, chose the person who seemed to best fit the position. It didn't work out.

The Board members are restarting the search process, but pausing briefly for two key steps. First, we'll step back to review the process and decide whether the job is the same as it seemed to be when Bridget left. Second, what can we learn from the prior search? We'll keep you updated as we move ahead. We'll ask for your thoughts and opinions. This is not a shy community!

On the **clear and clean water** topic, we were honored and excited to be awarded a grant of \$59,450 by the Midwest Glacial Lakes Partnership for our multi-year Watershed Diagnostic Study. The grant applies to 2024 and 2025 expenses, but we still are responsible for generating over \$50,000 each year to complete the study. We need help funding 2023 and later. Why is this so important? Longtime volunteer, Don Luepke, recently said it's all about "clarity." He and other Water Quality Committee members remind us that Clear Lake's depth clarity (how far down water is clear) is on a negative trend line. We have lost over ten feet of clarity in the past twenty years. What can you do? On the protected land front, winter storms were fierce. Our 100+ acres sustained widespread storm damage as trees toppled from unprecedented wind, snow and ice. Thank you to our land steward between September and this May, Madison Parker, and many volunteers led by our Lands Committee who cleared the debris and reopened our trails. The work is not done.
